KSKQ Programming Advisory Committee Description and Duties

The KSKQ Programming Advisory Committee (PAC) is responsible for selecting and approving all producers' programs, as well as syndicated programs concerning local issues, news, public affairs, religion, sports events, and other subjects. They also determine how programs will be structured and whether to edit or reschedule material for (re) broadcasting.

The KSKQ Programming Advisory Committee (PAC) is responsible for maintaining high quality programming that best serves our listening audience.

Membership composition:

The Programming Advisory Committee is comprised of up to 11 members: 50% KSKQ programmers and volunteers and 50% listeners at large and the Program Director. The Chair of the Programming Advisory Committee shall be elected by the members of the committee. Once nominated, members are approved by the KSKQ Management Committee.

Function:

The PAC is selected to assist the Program Director in valuable decision-making efforts. The PAC appoints 3 members to assist the PD to train and mentor new programmers. The committee meets quarterly to assess the entire schedule, discuss content and availability, review new proposals and implement new changes. The PAC assists the PD to develop an assessment tool and helps to evaluate shows. Participation is expected: a PAC member may be removed after two consecutive quarterly meeting absences.

A printed list of proposals and/or changes requested is provided in advance for consideration by the Program Director to the PAC members. Proposals are evaluated based on time requested, availability, over all content mix in the schedule, and flow of the schedule. All changes will be made with high regard and respect for everyone involved.

Philosophy:

The PAC is committed to keeping as much live and local possible. The goal is to maintain the mission of KSKQ and the MCASO, sharing in diversity, and keeping the power with the people.

Scheduling:

The KSKQ Programming Committee may grant programs to individuals only, although individuals may represent an organization or institution. Programs are granted for only one scheduling period at a time. Programming time slots are not guaranteed. From time to time, in the interest of keeping the schedule varied, flexible, and fresh, or for over-arching goals of the station, a program may not be renewed or may be relocated to another time slot. Programs may also not be renewed for aesthetic or policy reasons.
